- Referred to traffic lights to be energised at Dun Rí estate beside the school and roundabout on the Drumree road advised that the developer has contacted the ESB.
- Referred to the lack of communication from Uisce Eireann when closing roads due to works.
- Requested the report following the speed limit review in Kilmessan to follow up with transport.
- Sought update on wardens for Rathbeggan NS- to follow up with transport.
- Referred to claims to IPB not being acknowledged advised that IPB follow a process.
- Enquired when the tender for the pedestrian/cycleway in Ratoath will be awarded- to follow up with transportation.
- Enquired if council owned assets have been considered for serviced sites for housing- to follow up with housing.
