	changes in the draft Planning Bill.
	The Two-Year Progress report on the County Development Plan will be presented at the
	December Council meeting. The work programme for the remainder of the year will include





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the Settlement Capacity Audit for the county, preparation for Variation No. 1 of the CDP, Maynooth Joint Local Area Plan and monitoring of the Judicial Review cases and decisions.

The 2024 Programme will feature: Proposed Variation No.2, the Drogheda Joint Urban Area Plan, Land Value Sharing, Core Strategy Review, progression of the Navan Local Area Plan and Commercial monitoring.

## 4. To receive an update on submissions on the Draft Development Contribution Scheme

Majella Farrell updated the Committee on the public consultation on the draft contribution scheme which took place between 6/9/2023 and 18/10/2023.

Four submissions were received and are being considered. The draft amendments will be brought forward to the November Council meeting. Once agreed with the Members, the new development contribution scheme will come into operation in January 2024.

# To receive an update on submissions on the Meath Heritage Strategic Plan 2023-2030 (Draft)

Loreto Guinan, Heritage Officer provided an update on the eight proposed amendments to the draft plan following submissions received. The draft plan will now proceed to environmental assessment.

The Heritage Officer advised that the recent announcement regarding the development of the National Park at Dowth will be included in the plan.

#### 6. To receive an update on the Meath Economic Development Forum & the ED Section

Michelle Goodwin, Business Advisor informed the Committee of the launch of the Meath Economic Development Forum and the introductory meeting held on the 28<sup>th</sup> September 2023. The Forum will operate as an advisory group and develop their collective ideas and build a business strategy for the County. From November, a promotional campaign promoting Meath will begin via social media platforms, press and editorial pieces. The ED team have been focussing on the promotion of strategic employment sites and the creation





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of a brochure to inform discussions with the IDA, Enterprise Ireland, auctioneering firms, and potential investors/developers.

Des Foley, Director of Services outlined that the County was not limiting itself to any particular employment sectors but was showcasing all the county had to offer in terms of skills, education, connectivity and resources.
