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4.0 Statutory Business

4.1 Transportation

4.1.1 To receive an update on the proposed Housing Estate Special Speed Limit Bye-Laws Statutory Process

Gillian Mangan EE, Transportation updated on the proposed traffic calming measures. There were interventions from Councillors O'Reilly, Blake, O'Connor, Murphy & Everard which included:

- Some of the schemes mentioned relate to a nursing home and or one entrance projects that don't have a main Road. Should this be included?
- The Greenan estate has both 30km/h and 50km/h signs which are confusing. Why are we going from 30km/h to 50km/h and what is the justification?
- There was a general consensus from the Councillors they should not support increasing speed limits in housing estates.
- Could it be a suggestion that speed limits and ramps be agreed as part of the planning process and the cost of signs be covered by the developer?
- Can an update be given on the national speed limits, 50km/h or 80km/h?

Gillian will seek clarification on all transport issues of the above before the next Municipal District meeting.

4.1.2 To receive a Progress Report on works undertaken/planned for Ratoath Municipal District.

The report circulated in advance was noted and the following raised:

- Can a letter be sent to the ESB asking why there is no connection to the Lights and pedestrian crossing on the Red Bog Road?
- In Dunboyne Park can the painting and maintenance be carried out on under the high rider and table tennis area?
- When will the resurfacing of Dunshaughlin High Street take place?
- Can the settings and timing on the traffic lights on the Dunsany/Kilmessan Road be reviewed.
- What are the design updates for the proposed development opposite Supervalu Ratoath?
- Skryne, Kilbride Road why does gritting stop at the Fingal boarder when this has been raised in the past.
- If there is a mild winter can, and money is saved on gritting be placed into next year's budget to build a nest egg in preparation for severe winters.
- Can a list of proposed bus shelters for Meath be provided for 2025?
- Can the Transport SPC give an update on the trial of 'one additional road chosen' per MD to be gritted?
- Can the Road sweeper extend to the Maynooth Road?
- What is the update on the Arborist report?

The Executive Engineer responded accordingly and said the Arborist has been appointed and the





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programme of works has been given to the Arborist. Trees that are considered dangerous will be prioritized. With the regards to Pedestrian crossings, preliminary designs are complete and are awaiting contractors to start. All other maintenance issues were noted.

Fiona Fallon, Director, responded and saying she will make contact with the Transport SPC for an update on the one road trial scheme and seek an update on the Supervalu site and bus stops for Meath.
